## Language contact: empirical and formal aspects

## **Description:**

This seminar offers a combined empirical and formal approach to conducting linguistic research with special focus on language contact phenomena e.g. borrowings, code-switching, code mixing. It provides a more in-depth look into a sociolinguistic situations involving mutual interaction of at least two languages, as well as data-oriented and analytical approaches to it. The seminar course is coupled with a specialization course during which participants will become familiar with various types of data, data sources and methods of collecting data. This will equip them with the knowledge and skills necessary for gathering and analyzing them. They will also learn how to explain the linguistic facts illustrated by the collected data.
